Vocabulary

Saying what you like

I like...	Used to say you enjoy something.	<i>"I like pizza."</i>
I don't like...	Used to say you do not enjoy something.	<i>"I don't like coffee."</i>
I love...	A stronger way to say you like something very much.	<i>"I love dogs."</i>

Giving your opinion

I think... is good.	Used to say your opinion about something.	<i>"I think this film is good."</i>
I think... is bad.	Used to say you do not have a good opinion about something.	<i>"I think this food is bad."</i>
For me, ...	Used to show this is your personal opinion.	<i>"For me, English is easy."</i>

Agreeing and disagreeing

Yes, me too.	Used to agree when someone talks about themselves.	<i>"A: I like tea. B: Yes, me too."</i>
I agree.	A simple way to say you have the same opinion.	<i>"A: This book is good. B: I agree."</i>
I don't agree.	A simple way to say you have a different opinion.	<i>"A: This film is bad. B: I don't agree. I like it."</i>

Why: This is a complete, correct sentence using the phrase 'I don't like'.

2. Wrong: "Yes yes yes I agree I agree yes."

Answer: I agree.

Why: This shows agreement clearly in one simple sentence, without repeating words.

3. Wrong: "Coffee. Like. Me."

Answer: I like coffee.

Why: This is the correct word order: subject, verb, object.

Exercise 6: Error Identification

1. I likes chocolate very much.

Error: "likes" -> "like" | Verb error — after I, the verb should be like, not likes. We only add -s after he, she, or it.

2. I don't like mushrooms on pizza.

Answer: No error.

3. She like dogs very much.

Error: "like" -> "likes" | Verb error — after she, the verb needs an -s: likes, not like.

4. For me, English is easy.

Answer: No error.

5. I agree with you.

Answer: No error.

6. I don't agrees with that.

Error: "agrees" -> "agree" | Verb error — after don't, the verb should be in its base form: agree, not agrees.
