Introducing yourself

My name is...	Used to tell someone your name.	<i>"My name is Carlos."</i>
I'm from...	Used to say which country or city you are from.	<i>"I'm from Brazil."</i>
Nice to meet you.	A polite phrase used when you meet someone for the first time.	<i>"A: My name is Lucy. B: Nice to meet you, Lucy."</i>

Asking simple questions

What's your name?	Used to ask someone their name.	<i>"Hi! What's your name?"</i>
Where are you from?	Used to ask which country or city someone is from.	<i>"Where are you from? Are you from Spain?"</i>
How are you?	A common question used to ask how someone feels.	<i>"Hi Tom! How are you today?"</i>

Answering politely

I'm fine, thanks.	A common answer to 'How are you?'.	<i>"A: How are you? B: I'm fine, thanks. And you?"</i>
And you?	Used to ask the same question back to the other person.	<i>"A: How are you? B: Good, thanks. And you?"</i>
Pleased to meet you.	A polite phrase similar to 'nice to meet you', often used in slightly more formal situations.	<i>"A: This is my colleague, Marco. B: Pleased to meet you."</i>

Why: This puts the words in the correct order: subject, verb, place.

3. Wrong: "From. Spain. I."

Answer: I'm from Spain.

Why: This puts the words in the correct order: subject, verb, place.

Exercise 6: Error Identification

1. My name are Sofia.

Error: "are" -> "is" | Verb error — with 'name' (singular), we use is, not are.

2. What's your name?

Answer: No error.

3. I is from Poland.

Error: "is" -> "am" | Verb error — after I, we use am, not is. The correct form is 'I am' (I'm).

4. Where are you from?

Answer: No error.

5. Nice to meet you.

Answer: No error.

6. How is you today?

Error: "is" -> "are" | Verb error — with 'you', we use are, not is: How are you today?
