What Does Band 8–9 Actually Require?

At Band 7, you demonstrate consistent competence. At Band 8–9, the examiner expects near-native fluency, sophisticated language control, and the ability to handle complex, nuanced ideas with precision and ease. Errors are rare, and when they occur, they do not impede communication.

Skill	Band 7	Band 8–9
Listening	Understands most detail; occasional misheard word	Understands fully — including implied meaning, attitude, and tone
Reading	Handles most vocabulary; occasional inference gap	Understands all nuance, irony, and the writer's implicit position
Writing	Clear position; good range of structures	Sophisticated, nuanced argument; rare minor slips only
Speaking	Fluent with occasional hesitation; wide vocabulary	Effortless fluency; full idiomatic and colloquial command

Advanced Strategies by Skill

Listening

- Listen for the speaker's attitude — hedging, certainty, doubt, irony.
- In lectures, note how the speaker signals structure: 'Turning now to...'
- Distinguish main points from elaboration — don't be distracted by examples.

Reading

- Identify the writer's rhetorical stance — hypothesis, synthesis, or challenge.
- For multiple choice, wrong options are often partially correct — the right answer captures the full meaning.
- Matching sentence endings tests both grammatical and semantic fit.

Writing

- Task 1 (processes): describe each stage in order using passive constructions naturally.
- Task 2: your argument must contain genuine insight — not just summary.
- Choose words for exact meaning, not to sound impressive.

Speaking

- Use hedging naturally: 'It would seem that...' / 'One might argue...'
- Handle hypotheticals fluently: 'Were that to happen...'
- Show metalinguistic awareness: comment on your own language when it aids precision.
